SEX DIFFERENCES



FEMALES ARE MORE LIKELY TO EXPERIENCE...

- child maltreatment



MALES ARE MORE LIKELY TO EXPERIENCE...

- peer victimization (alone and combined with child maltreatment)

CHILD MALTREATMENT AND/OR PEER VICTIMIZATION ARE ASSOCIATED WITH...



Mental health conditions



Physical health conditions



Self-injury and suicidality



ADOLESCENTS WHO EXPERIENCE BOTH CHILD MALTREATMENT AND PEER VICTIMIZATION HAVE SOME OF THE WORST OUTCOMES
